At RGS, we hope a simple and shared dress code might make some daily decisions easier for students, especially for any who may have some personal anxiety about appearance, personal image and style. Similarly, we know from non-uniform days where we raise money for charities, some students find a uniform reduces peer-pressure to have expensive or fashionable styles of appearance.

It is also important that a young person feels that they belong, and we also hope a shared uniform might help foster a sense of shared identity and common purpose as a Reigatian, helping students feel part of *Team Reigate*: supported by others and supporting other members of a community of many different interests and strengths.

Please support the uniform codes, help us to protect some more vulnerable students and help us to reinforce our community’s support for all students’ diversity and personal differences which we hope would primarily be expressed through their qualities of character, values and actions.

A note about Games and PE days

On days when students have a Games or PE lesson, or if they have a fixture during curriculum time, they may come to school in approved RGS Kukri PE or Games Kit including – for all students – RGS tracksuit bottoms, leggings or cricket trousers whilst moving around the school and not in the actual games or PE activity. In the second half of the summer term or start of the autumn term (by exception and under direction of the Director of Sport and SLT) RGS approved navy shorts may be worn by students (but not skorts or athletics shorts).

When students have clubs before school, during lunch or after school they should wear their regular school uniform during all curriculum times and change into kit for their sports club sessions.

First to Fifth Form

General Appearance

Students must wear school uniform as set out below. On days when students have their double Games lesson, or a single PE lesson, they may wear sports kit. If students have sports practice, not a lesson, then they must wear their uniform and change.

A smart appearance is always expected.

- Haircuts must not be any shorter than a grade two and must be of a simple conventional style i.e. not mullets, fades or undercuts
- If hair is collar length or longer it must be tied up.
- If hair is dyed it should be in a modest conventional manner and only a natural occurring colour.
- Jewellery including for example: rings; bracelets; necklaces and friendship bands are not permitted.
- **One pair** of simple stud earrings, one in each lower lobe is permitted. Hoops, drop earrings etc. are not permitted, nor are nose or other piercings. Students may be asked to remove jewellery that does not meet the uniform code and it may be looked after by a member of staff and then collected by a parent.
- Natural make-up/concealer may be worn. Nails should be short and of a natural appearance. Coloured nail varnish should not be worn. Nail extensions, acrylic/gel nails and excessively long nails are not permitted. Eyelashes should be natural and not enhanced with additional lashes or treatment. If make-up or fake tan is very obvious or exaggerated, then a student may be asked to remove it.
- If worn, hijabs or turbans should be plain black or navy.
- Outdoor coats should be without large logos and should be long enough to cover the blazer and must not be worn instead of the blazer. Denim, leather or corduroy coats are not suitable.

Boys – Compulsory Items

- **RGS blazer*** – navy blue (with RGS badge)
- **School tie*** or school colours' tie, if awarded
- **Shirt** – plain white with a collar that should be buttoned up to the neck. Shirts may be short or long-sleeved. T-shirts/vests, if worn under shirts, should be plain white.
- **Trousers** – plain dark grey (not black)
- **Socks** – dark grey or black
- **Shoes** – black polishable shoes of simple conventional style with straps or laces. Suede or canvas shoes or trainers are not permitted; neither are boots or shoes with logos. Socks must be worn with shoes.

Boys – Optional

- **V-neck pullover** – plain navy blue (not black)
- A **hat** may be worn outside but should be removed indoors.
- Students performing in musical events will require **formal concert blacks**. This is defined as:
 - **First and Second Form:** Long-sleeved black collared shirt and black trousers, black socks, black shoes.
 - **Third Form upwards:** black trousers, collared black shirt, black socks, black shoes.
- Students taking **GCSE Drama** will need appropriate clothing for movement work in practical lessons. They will need plain black tracksuit bottoms or leggings and a plain black long-sleeved t-shirt.

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Girls – Compulsory Items

- **RGS blazer*** – navy blue (with RGS badge)
- **Skirt*** – navy kilt or pleat skirt. Skirts must not be rolled up and should be of an appropriate length for a school environment as determined by staff.
- **Trousers*** – navy Trutex.
- **Blouse** – plain white with revere collar, short, $\frac{3}{4}$ length or long sleeved. T-shirts/vests, if worn under blouses, should be plain white.
- **Socks/tights** – Socks and tights should be black, navy or white. Tights must not be torn or ripped.
- **Shoes** – black polishable shoes of simple conventional style which have straps or laces. Suede/canvas shoes or trainers are not permitted nor are boots or shoes with logos. Socks or tights must be worn with shoes.

Girls – Optional

- **V-neck pullover** – plain navy blue (not black)
- A **hat** may be worn outside but should be removed indoors.
- Students performing in musical events will require **formal concert blacks**. This is defined as:
 - **First and Second Form:** Long-sleeved black collared shirt and black trousers/skirt (knee length minimum), black socks/tights, black shoes.
 - **Third Form upwards:** Full length black dress with sleeves or full-length black skirt/trousers with sleeved black top, black socks/tights, black shoes.
- Students taking **GCSE Drama** will need appropriate clothing for movement work in practical lessons. They will need plain black tracksuit bottoms or leggings and a plain black long-sleeved t-shirt.

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First to Fifth Form – PE & Games Kit

For the days when students are allowed to wear their kit, rather than their school uniform, they are expected to wear either the RGS branded tracksuit bottoms or RGS branded leggings with the appropriate RGS games shirt.

NB: Hoodies are not permitted, students should wear an RGS blast fleece, over their RGS games shirt for warmth.

Boys – Core Compulsory Kit

- RGS reversible games shirt
- RGS tracksuit bottoms
- RGS blast fleece
- RGS blue PE shorts
- RGS rugby shorts for all students in first and second form and for those taking rugby in older year groups.
- RGS white PE polo shirt.
- RGS blue and white games socks

Girls – Core Compulsory Kit

- RGS reversible games shirt or RGS tailored reversible games shirt
- RGS tracksuit bottoms or RGS leggings
- RGS blast fleece
- RGS blue games skort or RGS blue PE shorts
- RGS white PE polo shirt
- RGS blue and white games socks
- RGS netball dress (for those involved in competitive fixtures, available from the Kukri Store only)

Boys/Girls – Compulsory non-Kukri supplied items

- PE socks – white
- Trainers – non-marking and non-flat sole: suitable for Astro
- Studded boots (either rugby or football boots) for all those playing grass-based sports including rugby, football, Ultimate or any other sports that may be played on the grass pitches. The studs may either be moulded plastic or metal safety studs.
- Mouthguard (essential for all students in the First to Third Forms and for anyone else playing rugby or hockey)
- Shin pads (for all students playing football or hockey)

Boys/Girls – Optional

- Base layer/skins – navy (winter) or white (summer)

For swimming

- RGS swimming costume/shorts – plain navy or plain black. Students may wear a tri-suit and competitive swimmers may wear jammers. Period swimsuits may also be worn.
- Optional plain black or navy rash vests may also be worn.
- RGS swimming cap – navy

Further optional and sport specific items

- RGS cricket shirt
- RGS cricket trousers
- RGS cricket fleece
- RGS netball dress (only available via the online [Kukri store](#)).
- RGS training smock top

Sixth Form

General Appearance

To mark their growing independence and maturity, Sixth Formers are given a degree of flexibility and are allowed to choose their own tailored plain suits. Accordingly, they are expected to take pride in what they wear, and to be smartly and soberly dressed.

- Haircuts must not be any shorter than grade two and should be of a simple conventional style, and of reasonable length. If hair is dyed it should be in a modest conventional manner and only of a natural colour.
- Boys should be clean-shaven.
- Jewellery may be worn and should be discreet and professional, not excessive in style or size e.g. plain earrings, no more than two piercings in each ear, one simple necklace and one ring. The Sixth Form staff team may ask students to remove any items which do not meet the dress code. No nose or other facial piercings are to be worn.
- Make-up should be discreet, professional and look natural including nails which should be short and any polish should be plain and light in colour – nail extensions/acrylics should not be worn.
- If worn, hijabs or turbans should be plain black, navy or white.
- Outdoor coats should be without large logos and long enough to cover the suit jacket. Denim, leather or corduroy coats are not suitable.

Compulsory Items

- Plain formal **tailored dark blue, dark grey or black business suit** (checks or stripes, if part of the fabric, should be muted). Trousers or skirts and jackets must match, i.e. *same colour and fabric*. Skirts or trousers should be an appropriate length for a business environment and should not be a tube/stretchy style.
- **School tie*** or **colours' tie** (if awarded) must be worn with a buttoned-up shirt.
- **Shirt/blouse** – shirts must be white, worn with a tie, tucked in and the collar must be buttoned to the top. Blouses must have a collar which can be seen above a jumper, they may be worn open-necked without a tie and should be tucked in. Both short and long-sleeved shirts/blouses are allowed.
- **Shoes** – should be leather in black or brown, polishable and of simple, low-heeled conventional style. Black leather trainers, canvas or suede shoes are not allowed, nor are boots or shoes with coloured or metallic logos.
- **Socks/tights** – socks/tights must be navy, dark grey, black. White sports socks are not allowed.

Optional Items

- **V-neck or quarter zip woolen jumper/cardigan/tank top** – plain dark blue, dark grey or black, worn over the shirt/blouse and worn under (and not instead of) a suit jacket and therefore needs to be light enough to do this. The jacket should always be worn around the school site.
- Students performing in musical events will require **formal concert blacks**. This is defined as:
 - Full length black dress with sleeves or full-length black skirt/trousers with sleeved black top (collared for boys), black socks/tights, black shoes.
- Students taking **A Level Drama** will need appropriate clothing for movement work in practical lessons. They will need plain black tracksuit bottoms or leggings and a plain black long-sleeved t-shirt.

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Sixth Form – Games Kit

All students in the RGS Sixth Form take part in games every Wednesday and there is a vast range of activities available. **We expect students to wear the core RGS kit** and this will be supplemented with additional items where needed, for example, cricket whites. The PE staff will tell students if they need anything specific to take part in an activity.

Compulsory

- RGS tracksuit bottoms or RGS leggings (girls)
- RGS senior training t-shirt
- RGS rugby and/or PE shorts (navy or white* unisex)
- Trainers/hockey footwear/rugby or football boots/Astro boots for anyone playing these sports on grass.
- Students must wear shoes which are appropriate for any activity and fashion trainers will not provide adequate support for sport at RGS.

Optional

- RGS senior training smock top (*NB: Hoodies should not be worn*)

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
